Delegitimizing Oppressive Discourse Training for Afghan Women

The 3rd Dialogue Session-One Day Workshop of Delegitimizing Oppressive Discourse Training for Afghan Women Women's Rights Activist on Women's Rights in Islamic Legal Framework On 19thApril 2017 one day workshop was arranged according to the plan to make a dialogue between the participants, 43 trainees, and scholars in Marmar Hotel. The conference started by the recitation of the Holy Quran by Mr. Fazal Ghani Kakar and the national anthem by the technical team of the organization. Then Ms. Jamila Afghani opened the program & welcomed the participants. Then she provided a brief report on the NECDO's activities and achievements of the projects. Also she added that between these 43 trainees a strong network has been build. Our aim for creating such program is to know about your expectations. And also she introduced the WILPF and asked from participants to join with WILPF. At the end she said: "hope to see you all as a leader in the future. Then Ms. Maryam Arya present the presentation about Democracy in Islamic context, At first she defined democracy then she talked about the similarities between Islam and democracy, then Ms. Madina talked about legal petition, defined defendant and claimant how to appeal in court, procedure of appeal and judicial system in Afghanistan. After that Ms. Shabnum presented presentation about Sharia law and its implementation in Islamic countries. Firstly, she explained Sharia Law, also specified the division of Islamic law and talked about the implementation of Sharia law in Islamic countries. Then there was a tea break from 10 to 10:30. Consequently, Ms. Barbie Reynolds vice president director of research &course development on Rebuild Consultants talked about Women's Leadership (Technicalities). Firstly, she defined leadership. Secondly, she talked about what are the leadership skills, Technicalities and also she mentioned some women leaders' names and she taught students why should women be in leadership? The importance of Good Role Models for Women in Leadership, she points out two key skills that every leader needs: 1. Interpersonal Communication 2. Women should be confident be courageous, after that there was lunch and prayer break time from 12 to 1, Then the participants were divided into groups and shared their point of views about bellow issues.

Annual Conference 2017 Role of Ulama In peace, Development, Respect to Human Rights and Love with Humanity

Summary:

On Monday 15th of May 2017 NUA Conference under the title Role of Ulama –NUA- in Peace, Development, respect to human rights and love with humanity was held in Safi Landmark Hotel in Kabul City. The conference was attended by 165 Ulama (100 male and 65 women), members of NUA Shura (BD) from Kabul, other provinces, delegation of Ulama from Indonesia, representative from Embassy, media groups, Government authorities and member of the security department. The conference was successfully completed in evening on the 16th of May; the Ulama showed their full support to the initiative and declared their readiness to work for peace together with Afghanistan Government for Peace, reconciliation and development. The conference was concluded by a press release which emphasized on the role of NUA in the peace process and asked the Afghan government to create space for NUA in the peace process and reconciliation efforts.

Explanation:

Based on the agreement with the respected embassy of Indonesia to conduct the 2 day annual conference under the theme "Role of Ulama (NUA) in Peace, Development, Respect to Human Rights and Love with Humanity" in Kabul Afghanistan to ensure the role of NUA-Ulama in peace and reconciliation, NUA begin its preparation and contacted NUA committees throughout the country to do arrangement for such an event to be conducted in May of 2017, the activities were accomplished chronologically as below:

- NUA organizing committee do all the arrangements, communication on central & provincial level, preparing lists, sending out invitations, hotel booking and contacting local government authorities and networking with concerned government institutions
- NUA (Shura) develop agenda for the conference and sending out letters of getting support from MoRA, MoFA and MoJ
- Doing all logistic arrangements, printing banners, posters, brochures and copying all the required administrative papers
- Doing time to time communication with participants and the concerned government departments
- Held consultative meetings within NUA Shura (BD) in Kabul for updates and getting further instructions for the betterment of the conference

- Preparations were finalized for the travel of the NUA members to Kabul and moved by the 14th of May 2017 (The delegates were received in Kabul by the organizing committee)
- The conference was held successfully on 15th May in the Hall of Safi Landmark in accordance to the agenda

Conference Activities

- The conference commenced with the recitation of few verses from Holy Quran by Mr. Qari Muhammad Murtadha member of NUA Kabul Committee followed by national anthem of both brotherly countries Afghanistan and Indonesia, followed by welcome speech of Mr. Hashemi Head of NUA. Later the remarks by Mr. Lukman Hakim from the Indonesian Embassy, followed by introduction to the goals and objectives of the conference by Mr. Kakar who introduced the goal and objective of the conference to the audience through a power point presentation.
 - During the tea break a group photos was pitched by the participants, delegates, Ulama and NUA Shura members (male and female)
 - The program went in accordance to the plan and the agenda the speeches of the delegates from Indonesia were welcomed by the participants and in particular the dynamic speech of his Excellency Mr. Arief Rachan the ambassador made the eyes of the participants full of tears
 - The speakers supported the 5 principals of NUA (Moderation, Social Justice, Tolerance, Balance and Participation)
 - The provincial committees thanked NUA shura (BD) for the initiative and appreciated the support of respected embassy of Indonesia for the technical and financial support to facilitate the conference, they all in their speeches emphasized on the role of Ulama in peace and showed their commitment to work together with the Ulama in the country for this holy cause, they said peace is as blood for the life of development and progress even the worship cannot be fulfilled without peace
 - The Financial self-reliance plan was introduced by Mr. Kakar through a power point presentation and the committee of NUA in the provincial committees was given the responsibility to work for ensuring the plan.
 - The election for the 2 next years was contested among 4 Shura members, Mr. Sayed Salahuddin Hashemi, Mr. Dr. Muhammad Sulaiman Nesary, Mr. Muhammad Sarwar Sarwari, and Mr. Ahmad Noor Wqef. 118 participants Mr. Hashemi selected and program is closed.

Brief description on AF- 3226

NECDO is implementing the AF- 3226 was the time table workshop introduced?

The project was signed in Jan 2017 and will end in December 2017. The project covers Kabul .Khost, Balkh, Kapisa provinces. The major beneficiaries of this project are Mobilizing Afghan Men to protect women rights Peace and Democracy. With the following goal and objectives.

Overall Goal of the project: To enhance local communities' resiliency, cohesion and capacity to promote a peaceful transition by conducting activities to support and protect women rights, the ability of traditional dispute resolution bodies to resolve disputes in particular related to women issues and to bridge the gap between these bodies, communities, CSOs and formal justice and other government officials.

Objectives:

To train 400 influential men (Imams and Community leaders) and youths and 200 women activists in 4 provinces of Kabul (2 districts Shakar Dara and Farza), Balkh (where during this year there has been 20% increase in violence against womenthere have been 900 cases registered this year), Kapisa (where the violence of divorce, women burning has increased), Khost (where honor killing increased and less cases of women get registered due to traditions)

To establish 4 networks (1 in each province) of men and youths who will work and protect women rights on volunteer basis

- To develop a standard training manual on mobilizing Afghan man to protect woman rights based on national and international laws, conventions and declarations as well as five core rights of women in Islam (Right to Education, Right of Marriage-Divorce, Right of Ownership and possession, Right of social and political participation, Right of Inheritance) in Dari & Pashto languages
- To hold one provincial workshop (Conference) in each province by the end of workshops and will bring together the beneficiaries to share their views and to make working strategies and establish their network (CWG)
